Biography of missionary Pablo J. Palacio Of the House of Prayer For All Nations Ministry" (ADCOP)

The missionary Pablo J. Palacio was born on April 11, 1977, in the United States of America, Urbana, Illinois in Champaign County, the son of Ecuadorian parents: Jose Xavier Palacio Gonzalez and Mariana De Jesus Nunez del Arco, into a family of four brothers and one deceased. His father went to the United States for a master's degree in Civil Engineering. When the Missionary Pablo J. Palacio was 8 months old, his parents



returned with him to Ecuador where he was raised until the age of 21. In 1999 he decided to return to his homeland to continue his studies in Civil Engineering, career he had begun at University of Guayaquil, in Ecuador. The Missionary Pablo J. Palacio arrived in the city of Norwalk, State of Connecticut in the house of his uncle Alfredo on March 6, 1999. The following month he accepted the Lord Jesus as his only Savior through his aunt, Janet Marcillo, and in the same month he was baptized in the waters in the Pentecostal Church John 3:16 A / D. He served honorably in the United States Army for 5 months from 04/2000 to 09/2000. His name is on the Honored Veterans Archives and received an Honorable Veteran Certified by the U.S. Congress and the American Legion.

The Missionary Pablo Palacio studied at Norwalk Community College during the 2001-2002 academic year, where he worked volunteering as a tutor for mathematics students.

In the year 2005 by the grace of God, Pablo Palacio came to the House of Prayer for All Nations Ministry of the Assemblies of God (ADCOP) in the city of Danbury, State of Connecticut, where he was the first missionary who was consecrated in this church, and passed by the Convention of the Council of the Spanish Eastern District of the Assemblies of God as Certified Minister on July 13, 2007. He is currently continuing his studies in theology through the Study Center of Global University and where he works as a teacher.
